Survivor Benefits—New Service Available on the Web

Defense Finance & Accounting Service officials report that survivors can now use a "fast form" to report the passing of a retiree on the Internet rather than waiting on the phone.

The DFAS Form 9221 for notification of death can be processed quicker than faxed or emailed forms, said officials, and they save paper and postage costs. Officials warn that if a survivor doesn't receive confirmation of receipt from DFAS within 48 hours of submitting the form, they should call 800-321-1080. The form can be submitted online from the privacy of a customer's home, or with the help of a casualty assistance representative. Submitting the form initiates all of the same actions as a DFAS customer care representative would.

The notification-of-death form is only for reporting the death of a military retiree. Annuitant deaths must still be reported to one of the DFAS customer care representatives at 800-321-1080. To access the notification of death fast form, click on the link at www.dfas.mil/retiredmilitary/forms.html or cut and paste the link into your web browser address bar.

61st Medical Squadron Services For Retirees

SCRIPT CENTER: Looking for a no fuss, no hassle way to pick up your refilled medications? Try the new Script Center, now located in the main BX. Enrollment in the system is quick and easy and refills may be picked up anytime the BX is open.

MAIN PHARMACY: The main Pharmacy will be implementing a new Medication Renewal program. Patients taking certain medications may be able to have a phar-

macist renew the prescription when no more refills are available. Check with the Main Pharmacy for more information on this program.

FT. MACARTHUR: Medication refills may be picked up at the Ft. MacArthur Clinic Mon - Fri during clinic hours.

PRESCRIPTION GLASSES: Retirees may obtain one pair of standard issue eyeglasses once a year from the Optometry Clinic.

IMMUNIZATIONS: The availability of vaccinations for non-enrolled beneficiaries may fluctuate because of supply and/or budget constraints. Before making a special trip, contact the clinic at 310-653-6607 for information on whether a vaccine is available.

Shingles Vaccine: Shingles (also called herpes zoster, after the virus that causes shingles) can affect anyone who has had chicken pox. The varicella zoster virus causes chicken pox; it remains dormant in the body after the acute chicken pox disease is over. Years after the original infection, this virus sometimes reactivates in the form of shingles. Zostavax, the vaccine that helps prevent shingles, is made from a special live virus that causes shingles. The vaccine is recommended for many adults age 55 and older. Consult your doctor for advice and to answer your questions about the vaccine. Then contact Immunizations Clinic at (310) 653-6607 for information on how to obtain a packet that includes a list of network providers who provide the vaccine and TRICARE claims forms to file for reimbursement.

AIR FORCE RETIREE WEBSITE

Did you know that the Air Force has a Web site just for its retiree community that is full of news and information, plus it is easy to access and navigate. The Air Force Retiree Services site is located at www.retirees.af.mil. This public Web site offers the retiree family in-depth information on the Survivor Benefit Plan, plus a list of Air Force retiree activities offices worldwide and various other resources. There are also sections dedicated to the Afterburner and Air Force Retiree News Service. Visitors can access the sections by using the top navigation bar on the home page. The home page also features the latest Air Force headline news and video clips. There is even a special icon for quick access to Combat-Related Special Compensation Information page. Subscribing to the electronic version of the Afterburner and the AFRNS is now much easier; just click on the word "Subscribe" found on the top navigation bar. Find "Afterburner/AFRNS" near the top of the second column and enter your email address. From there you will be asked to submit your preference for receiving the newsletter and other publications . This is a great paperless option to use for staying in touch and find out what is happening in the DoD and other agencies.

AIR FORCE LODGING RESERVATIONS GO ONLINE

The Defense Lodging System (DLS) now features online reservations and the capability for customers to leave online feedback about their stay at one of the Air Force Lodging facilities. DLS provides an additional channel to enhance customer service and increase room occupancy with online reservations, where they can immediately capture and track customer feedback to improve any weak areas. SPACE "A" TRAVEL INFORMATION ON THE WEB

If you are looking for Space "A" information, you may want to try Facebook. Select passenger terminals across Air Mobility Command are establishing pages on Facebook to provide passengers with more predictability when it comes to space-available and space-required passengers. Nine passenger terminals in the space-available travel program recently started posting which flights are available and how many seats there are for flights up to 72 hours in advance on their Facebook pages.

Interested travelers can find their local passenger terminal's page on Facebook by entering the base's name followed by "passenger terminal," for example: "Andrews passenger terminal." Each page will have a picture of the installation's passenger terminal as their profile to help followers "like" the correct page. AMC reminds traveler's that even with the launch of these new Facebook pages, all flights are subject to change without notice.

ARE YOUR LEGAL AFFAIRS IN ORDER?

Insuring that one's legal affairs are in order is an important part of the entire retirement package. At a minimum you and your spouse, if married, should have a Will, an Advance Health Care Directive and perhaps a durable general power of attorney. And this is just the start. One of the recurring issues seen in a legal office is the situation where just one of the spouses has handled all of the financial matters and the surviving spouse suddenly finds himself or herself without any idea of the family financial situation. Take the time to gather legal and financial documents, including information on your assets and outstanding debt and organize in a binder or other method. If you have a safe deposit box, information on the bank and the key should be located with these documents. Advance directives should not be kept in a safe deposit box if the key is not accessible during a health crisis. Contact the base legal office if you need additional information.
